To determine if you are running the latest version of your web browser and Adobe Flash, we recommend that you do the following:

Step-by-step guide

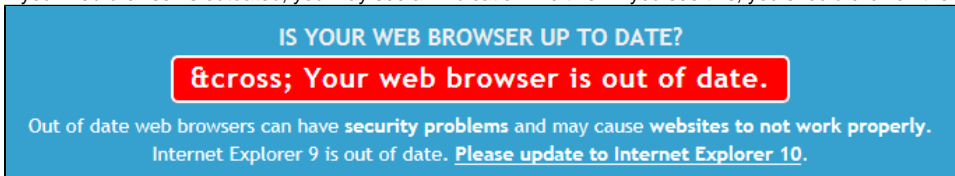
1. Open your web browser and visit www.whatismybrowser.com.

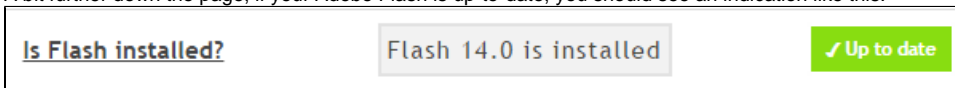
2. If your web browser is up-to-date, you should see an indication like this:



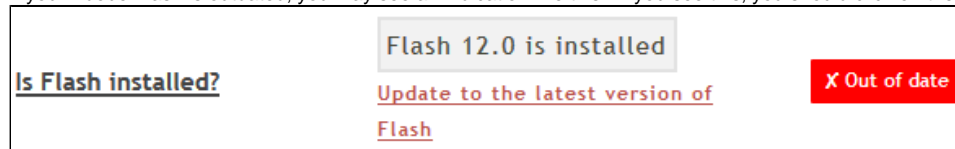
If your web browser is outdated, you may see an indication like this. If you see this, you should click on the link to install the update.



3. A bit further down the page, if your Adobe Flash is up-to-date, you should see an indication like this:



If your Adobe Flash is outdated, you may see an indication like this. If you see this, you should click on the link to install the update:
